Pacific Bridges Project

A new cultural initiative has been developed at the Davis Humanities Institute with the title of the Pacific Bridges Project. This is designed to introduce contemporary Pacific perspectives into the interdisciplinary research programmes fostered by the Institute as well as to encourage the integration of Pacific material into under-graduate and graduate teaching in courses in the humanities, the social sciences and the environmental sciences. It will run over the next five years and will seek to develop collaborative work between scholars and key figures in cultural institutions in Australia, New Zealand, Japan and California.

The aim of the Institute is to place contemporary re-examinations of such issues as national and personal identity, land use, tourism and public memory in each country within a transnational framework. In particular, the Institute proposes to analyse the models and metaphors by which each group represents its own and each other's culture, at home and abroad. Further details will be given in future issues.

Discussions about Maori rights under the Treaty of Waitangi are for the most part conducted as if the points at issue are somhow unique to New Zealand. In this book a distinguished group of contributors places the Treaty in an international context. They focus on the way public power has come to be exercised in relationships between English speaking colonisers and indigenous peoples in North America and the Pacific, and ask whether the Treaty has a unique place in relationships between colonising nations and indigenous peoples.
